Hello Anne - Marie,

I appreciate your confirmation for my delegation to the Regional Council held today, September 17th, 2020.

I would like to put in my place Angela Braun as my delegate. For many years, Angela is a professional educator of children and youth. She is also a mother of children and curriculum advisor for the educational movement:- "Veritatis Splendor" which is in the developing process.

I wouldn't be able to come on time to the Zoom meeting. Therefore, I would like Angela Braun (her address and phone number is provided below) to speak today on the following topic:

Against Mandatory, "New Norms" / Measures (especially in regards to children):

1) Who is taking the responsibility for the harm created by the mandatory measures - especially in a relation to children while in schools and recreational institutions?

Public Health Ontario is not taking any responsibility for mandatory masks, tests and sanitizers. Therefore, any harm done to children from these measures has to be addressed for reliability towards those, who directly imposed such measures and created by-laws.

2) What medical data say about mandatory masks, social distancing and lockdown imposed on children?

Toronto Sick Kids Panel original report "Non-medical and medical face masks are not required or recommended for children returning to school.

strict physical distancing should not be emphasized to children in the school setting as **it is not practical and could cause significant psychological harm**

• Close interaction, such as playing and socializing is central to child development and should not be discouraged

• During outdoor activities, such as recess, physical distancing should not be required

• Sports and physical education classes should be encouraged and continue according to available protocols.

• Schools should endeavour to offer as many of their usual clubs and activities as possible."

3) Conclusion:

There is no medical data that would support any of the imposed measures in a relationship to COVID -19. In case of children there is almost 0% of death rates and spread. This particular type of coronavirus is less harmful then every seasonal flu. However mandatory measures are very harmful to people's health (both: physical and mental); and has devastating effects on people's financial well being as it collapses our economy (Niagara region suffers tremendous devastation of small businesses).

In regards to children, schools and taxes:

Many of us did not sent our children to schools this year as forced mandatory measures are extremely dangerous to the well being of our children. Therefore, in addition, we should be exempt from paying taxes for schools that we do not wish to support at this point.

Once again, we do not agree on the mandatory measures such as: masks, social distancing, lockdown or possibility of mandated vaccination. 
