Canada Health Act

 Accessibility is a core principle of the Canada Health Act.

 The ability to access healthcare services has long been considered a 'right' by Canadian citizens and is protected under the Canada Health Act.







Top 5 Transportation Barriers to Healthcare Access

- 1. Transportation Infrastructure: Limited availability and routes
- 2. Transportation Costs: High cost of fares, and personal vehicle expenses (i.e. insurance, gas, maintenance)
- 3. Vehicle Access: Lack of personal vehicle, lack of access to a vehicle through friends or family
- 4. Distance and Time Burden: Long travel distances, lengthy wait times, and inconvenient or erroneous time schedules
- **5. Policy:** Budget cuts resulting in bus and train shortages, routes removed and lack of adequate transit in underserved areas

Impact on Healthcare

- Missed appointments, negatively impacting health and quality of life
- Limited pharmacy access and decreased prescriptions filled
- Economic burden for patients and health system

Older Adult Population


- Niagara has an aging population with 21.4% age 65 and over compared to Ontario at 16.7% (2016 Census).
- As the Niagara population will grow and age over the next 20 years, seniors 75 and over projected to increase by 100% percent (2016 Census).


Niagara's Geography

People who live in rural areas may have difficulties in accessing healthcare due to a lack of services, isolation or a lack of mobility (Niagara Region, 2021).

Living in rural areas may also limit walkability, access to community and social supports and access to healthy food (Niagara Region, 2021).




Importance of Patient Access

86.7% residents stay in Niagara for care

97% stay in Niagara for Complex Care

66% at NH & 31% at Hotel Dieu Shaver (HDS)



- Patients travel across the region to access services at Niac Dieu Shaver.
- Niagara Health is expanding its regional model of service delivery, as the new South Niagara Site will assist to consolidate and expand acute care services for the region.
- Niagara Health sites will offer regional Centres of Excellence with high concentrations of expertise and resources.
- The transit hub included in the design of the South Niagara Site is a key component to a connected system.
- Hotel Dieu Shaver, located in St. Catharines, is Niagara's only rehabilitation hospital serving the entire Niagara region.
