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Two-Tier Government Structure

Greater Niagara consists of twelve local area municipalities (lower tier) and one regional government (upper-tier)

Niagara Region (upper-tier) was created in 1970 to provide services and programs that are more costeffective to deliver over a larger geographic area such as social services and infrastructure



Conduct

- Declare a conflict of interest when you have a direct or indirect pecuniary interest (financial interest) in a matter or if you have another interest in the matter (i.e. personal interest).
 - Once a conflict has been declared, Committee members must not take part in any discussion or vote on the matter.
