- The capital needs identified by the Region's consultants and staff have been incorporated into the DC calculations




Summary of Growth Forecast









Status of Transit Services

- Recently the Region received approval/authority to amalgamate all transit services and establish a Niagara Region Transit Commission
- As a result, Transit services are being reviewed for inclusion in the D.C. by-law
- Meetings with staff ongoing

- The resultant DCs calculated would be in addition to the proposed charges presented on previous slides.
- Transit DCs would take effect January 1, 2023
