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# **Terminology**

- MHSW Municipal Hazardous and Special Waste
- HSP Hazardous and Special Products



# **History of Steward Program**

- HHW has been collected in Ontario since the early 1990's
- Municipalities fully funded HHW program until the late 2000s
- 2006 Ontario Minister of the Environment directed Waste Diversion Ontario to develop a waste diversion program for MHSW, with Stewardship Ontario overseeing the program.
- 2021 HSP Regulation took effect October 1, 2021 requiring Producers to be responsible for end of life cost for the materials HSP designated materials.
- Main HSP Producer Responsibility Organizations (PROs)
  - Automotive Stewardship (AMS)
  - Product Care Association (PCA)
  - Ryse Solutions



# **HSP Regulation and Funding Issues**

#### **Designated Materials**

Identifies which materials are included as part of the Regulation

#### **Collection of Designated Materials**

Sets out collection site requirements based on size of Producer and municipal population

#### **Recycling Targets**

Lack minimum recycling target. Targets limited to number of collection sites.

#### **Funding**

Funding formula unspecified in Regulation



# **HSP Regulation Material Categories**

- Non-refillable pressurized containers
- Oil filters

- Paints and coatings

## **Number of Collection Sites**

- Producers are categorized as small or large based on the number of tonnes put into the marketplace.
- Minimum number of collection sites varies for small and large Producers.
- The number of sites required in Niagara region for large Producers is based on LAM populations

## Issues

- Accessibility targets are difficult to define for compliance/enforcement as producers can supplement sites with events and incorporate return to retail sites.
- Require residents to travel to more collection sites
- Return to Retail sites may fluctuate
- Lack of service providers



# **Recycling Targets**

- Regulation only specifies a minimum number of collection sites.
- No mandatory requirement for overall recycling; management targets/recycling targets are critical to drive collection of materials by producers.
- Other EPR program have established targets
  - Batteries
    - 2022 40%
    - 2023 40%
    - 2024 45%
    - 2025 50%
  - Electronics
    - 2022 55%
    - 2023 60%
    - 2024 65%
    - 2025 70%
  - Tires
    - 85% of tires must be recycled









# **Current Funding vs. Proposed Funding - Product Care Association**

- Current funding agreement with PCA is based on the hours of HHW depot operation.
- PCA indicated a change in the compensation model from an hourly rate to quantity (weight) basis.
  - No CPI since 2015, offered 4% CPI as part of new agreement
- PCA met with Niagara Region staff in December to describe the proposed quantity-based funding model.
- Niagara Region is negotiating a new agreement with PCA.
- Risk to Niagara Region Volume Fluctuation
  - For PCA to meet the requirements for the HSP regulations, additional collections sites/events will be required, potentially reducing the collection volume at Niagara Region HHW depot sites, which may impact funding.




## **Financial Concerns**





2023 anticipated cost incl. new tender prices & PCA proposed funding - \$999,000



Producer Responsibility Funding Programs

#### **Cost Drivers**

- PCA is proposing funding based on the volume collected in 2021.
  - Niagara Region would receive approximately \$47,000 less funding in 2023 than in 2022.
- New tender issued fall of 2022, for Operations,
   Haulage and Processing
  - 44% contract increase
- Management of non-designated materials
  - Regulation does not include all materials resulting \$628,000 being paid by residents



## Other Financial Impacts

#### **Increased Costs**

- Expanding Foam no longer funded under the new HSP regulation estimated annual cost to Niagara Region \$28,500
- Used Oil not part of HSP Regulation and no longer generates revenue since COVID
  - Niagara Region is paying to recycle it estimated cost of \$45,000 per year
- New contract took effect on January 1, 2023 for HHW depot operations, haulage and processing of MHSW material collected
  - \$129,000 contract increase for haulage and processing



# **Next Steps**

- Continue to negotiate with PCA
- Review Service Options:

#### **Status Quo**

Continue to operate the Region's HHW depots

#### **Reduce Service Levels**

- Reduce hours of operation
- Only accept designated materials
- Stop accepting non-designated materials / re-direct residents

#### **Cease Operating HHW Depots**

- Close depots
- Re-introduce event days as an alternative
- Region continues advocacy through industry organizations such as AMO & Municipal Waste Association
