Of the participants that attended the sessions and completed demographic information, the majority identifies as a woman (94 per cent). A small proportion identified as 2SLGBTQQIA+ (6 per cent). There was some racial diversity present among participants.

- 1 per cent were Hispanic
- 3 per cent were Indigenous
- 2 per cent were of Mixed origin
- 5 per cent were South Asian or East Indian
- 69 per cent were White

There was a large range of ages among participants

- 3 per cent were 15-29
- 15 per cent were 30-39
- 38 per cent were 40-54
- 21 per cent were 55-65
- 9 per cent were over 65




Figure 1: Percentage of Women Candidates for 2022 Municipal Elections




Figure 2: Percentage of Women Councillors Elected in 2022 Municipal Elections
