Walker's Application

- No need established for additional aggregate facilities 13x more than needed in Ontario
 - 3600 Licences
 - 2450 Permits
- Walker associated with over 40 quarries in Ontario
- Several Technical Reports but <u>No assessment of social / human effects</u>...
- •Inadequate/incomplete information submitted by Walker
 - E.g., borehole logs, complete archeological study
- National Pollutant Release Inventory <500,000 t/yr</p>






Alternative Site Analysis

- "In determining the overall study area and potential alternative sites, <u>Walker identified</u> a geographic area to situate a new quarry to replace the depleting nearby Walker Brothers Quarry which is just over 2 kms away ("Market Area")"...(alternative site analysis report)

Alternative Site Analysis – Conflict?

NF Review – May 5, 2023

In an interview Friday, Lococo said while the council session in August was considered a public meeting because it was on the agenda, it didn't go through the "normal notification" process where the public would have had a certain number of days' notice, as is the case with the typical planning process.

"So, unless you saw it on the agenda, you wouldn't have known. I am concerned. I think transparency is very important."

During the meeting, representatives from the architecture, engineering, planning and technology firm IBI Group addressed politicians on behalf of two landowners in the area, Hospitality Resorts Inc. (**the DiCosimo family) and Walker Aggregates**.

Together, they own two parcels of land side by side totalling about 105 hectares, where the agritourism complex is proposed, on the brow of the Niagara Escarpment and on the south side of Mountain Road.


