Gross Budget Increase for Seaway Wastewater Treatment Plant Influent Channel Upgrade

Moved by Councillor Insinna Seconded by Councillor Rigby

That Report PW 23-2024, dated August 13, 2024, respecting Gross Budget Increase for Seaway Wastewater Treatment Plant Influent Channel Upgrade, **BE RECEIVED** and the following recommendations **BE APPROVED**:

- 1. That the gross capital budget for the Seaway Wastewater Treatment Plant Influent Channel Project **BE INCREASED** by \$5,850,000 and that the increase **BE FUNDED** as follows:
 - Capital Variance Project Wastewater \$477,500
 - Development Charges Wastewater \$5,372,500
- That the authority to award the tender for the construction of the Seaway Wastewater Treatment Plant Influent Channel Project to the lowest compliant bidder **BE DELEGATED** to the Commissioner of Public Works, provided that such award is within the approved budget; and
- 3. That the Commissioner of Public Works **BE AUTHORIZED** to execute the resulting construction agreement with the lowest compliant bidder for the competitively tendered works within approved budget in a form satisfactory to the Director of Legal and Court Services.
