

What is the Early Development Instrument (EDI)?

- Validated tool created by The Offord Centre
- Assesses the developmental health and wellbeing of children in Senior Kindergarten (Year 2)
- Mandated by the Ministry of Education
- 103 questions per child, completed by the class teacher
- Conducted every 3 years







What does EDI Measure?

What does the EDI Analyze?

After the assessment is complete the results are categorized by:

- 1. On track
- 2. At Risk
- 3. Vulnerable

All results demonstrate students who are vulnerable. Vulnerable students are those who have a score below the 10th percentile. These children are considered to be at increased risk of difficulties and, without additional support, may continue to experience challenges.





Niagara's Results





Niagara Children Captured in the EDI

- A total sample of 3897 children for 2022-2023
- 49.9% were girls and 50.1% were boys with an average age of 5.9 years
- 2% were French immersion
- 10% ESL / FSL
- In 2023 average of 23.3 days absent vs. 10.1 days in 2018






Communication Skills & General Knowledge

Assesses how physically independent and healthy children are and whether children have mastered motor skills








Social Competence

Assesses how children play and get along with others, share, and show self-confidence








Emotional Maturity

Assesses how well children concentrate on tasks and help others, show patience, and whether they are often aggressive or angry








Language & Cognitive Development


Assesses how interested children are in reading and writing and their skills in numeracy and literacy






Communication Skills & General Knowledge

Niagara's Approach





Children's Services Planning and Programming

- Review of Special Needs Resourcing
- Invested in EarlyON outdoor training and programming
- Increased fee subsidy camp access via contracts with local municipalities
- New Early Years and Child Care Service System Plan
- Collaborative/ joint committees to influence programming planning (i.e. School Boards, community agencies, Public Health, etc.)
- Integration of services to provide wrap-around services





Collaboration with the Niagara Poverty Reduction Strategy

- Strategy addresses 8 interrelated Areas of Focus including Early Child Development
- Recommendation and actions: Improve access to affordable, high-quality childcare for families living in poverty or at risk of poverty.
 - Continue to implement the Canada Wide Early Learning and Child Care
 - Continue to expand childcare spaces
- Use funding from Niagara Prosperity Initiative to advance the strategy





Interdisciplinary work with Public Health

- Home visiting program for families (i.e. Nurse-Family Partnership, Healthy Babies Healthy Children, Infant and Child Development Services, etc.)
- Program and services to support parents (i.e. Postpartum Support, Infant Feeding Support, Positive Parenting Program, etc.)
- Community building and improving access in neighbourhoods that are disproportionately impacted by the social determinants of health (e.g. community gardens, social prescribing, food access programming)
- Capacity Building Strategies to support families (i.e. Niagara Parents Outreach, ACES-Informed Pandemic Recovery Project, Enhanced 18month Well-baby Visit and Emergent Literacy Initiative




EDI Vulnerability in Physical Health & Wellbeing 2023








EDI Vulnerability in Social Competence 2023








EDI Vulnerability in Emotional Maturity in 2023
