HART Hub Overview

- Niagara 1 of 27 Homelessness and Addiction Recovery Treatment (HART) Hubs
- 3-year Demonstration Project, beginning Spring 2025
- Up to \$6.3 million per year







Homelessness in Niagara

- 1193 individuals experiencing homelessness, 629 considered chronic
- 16% of chronic individuals identify as Indigenous
- Majority are adult, single







Mental Health and Addictions in Niagara

- Needs Based Planning estimates gaps in mental health and addictions services
- Niagara's large and significant gaps:
 - Mental health/substance use community services
 - Peer and family supports
 - Intensive case management services
 - Supportive housing
 - Specialized addiction medicine







Engagement

- Mental Health and Addictions Sector Leadership
- Homelessness Leadership
- Niagara's Lived Expert Advisory on Homelessness
- Youth Wellness Hub
- Community Partners







Trauma Informed and Non-Traditional Approach

- Less likely to access traditional services
 - History of Trauma
 - Previous difficult experiences with healthcare
- Mobile or clinic opportunities
- Outreach
- Peer support







Primary Care for Addiction Medicine

- Numerous barriers to primary health care
- Primary care well suited for addictions medicine
- Team based care includes outreach and flexibility







Indigenous Specific Supports

- Indigenous people disproportionately impacted by homelessness
- Local Indigenous health provider in Hub
- Designated units in supportive housing for Indigenous clients







Social Isolation in Homelessness

- Isolation and loneliness in homelessness
- Trend of return to homeless serving spaces once housed
- Hub provides connection to community
- Hub provides opportunities for productivity







Niagara's Hub Model

- Adult, chronic homelessness, mental health/substance use challenges
- Needs not often met through traditional programs
- Multidisciplinary team-based care
- Supportive housing
- Alternate levels of care based on identified need
- Region-wide mobile or in clinic services
