

## Niagara-Specific: Niagara Week



- Eight (8) in-person delegations with cabinet members.
- Meeting outcomes included:
  - Reaffirmed support for one-third funding for the South Niagara Wastewater Treatment Solution project, predicated on federal partnership.
  - Follow up discussions with ministers and senior staff regarding shared services and the expansion of GO train service.

#### GR functions: advocate, partner and educate.





# Niagara-Specific: SNWTS Project

- Business case created and shared with cabinet ministers, MPPs and MPs.
- Secured letters of support from area municipalities and community organizations.
- Project showcased in FCM's Municipal Growth Framework.
- Senior staff meetings with:
  - The Ministry of Housing, Infrastructure and Communities (federal).
  - Canada Infrastructure Bank (federal).
  - Infrastructure Ontario (provincial).

## Niagara-Specific: Asahi Kasei Support



- In partnership with the City of Port Colborne, provincial and federal advocacy was undertaken to secure support for infrastructure investments required for the site.
- This included:
  - Hosting a roundtable with federal ministers on November 14, 2024.
  - 3 meetings with senior staff within Infrastructure Ontario (provincial) and the Canada Infrastructure Bank (federal).

# Niagara-Specific: Joint Regional Advocacy

- Led joint advocacy initiatives in partnership with the Regions of Durham, Halton, Peel, Waterloo and York.
- Goal: enhance future provincial and federal program development by educating upper levels of government about two-tier municipalities.
- Accomplishments include:
  - Development of Regional Overview.
  - Meetings with senior provincial and federal staff.
  - Virtual delegations with 3 federal ministers.
  - Joint pre-budget submission drafted for 2025.

#### GR functions supported: partner, educate, advocate.








# Activities Completed 2023, 2024

- Growing Better Together unified branding
- Niagara Week
- AMO
- Increased recognition of Niagara's thought leadership: best practice sharing, communities of practice established, GR website
- Federal advocacy
- Targeted campaigns for corporate advocacy priorities
- GO Expansion: focused engagement including a GR firm secured and Mayors/Chair working group formed







### **Positive Announcements**

- Reaffirmed commitment for the Grimsby GO station.
- Support for housing and homelessness initiatives, such as the Lions Douglas site.
- Additional supports for mental health and addictions services, including the recent HART Hub announcement.
- Introduction of the provincial Municipal Housing Infrastructure Program, which has provided support two (2) Regional infrastructure projects.
- Federal funding for Niagara Transit.





## **Building on Success**

- Provincial and federal pre-budget submission (February)
- Provincial and federal election/post-election engagement (ongoing)
- Niagara Week (June)
- AMO participation (August)
- Federal advocacy (Q4)
- Joint advocacy with Regional peers, area municipalities and associations (ongoing)
- Advocacy for Region-specific initiatives (ongoing)







### **Advocacy Focus**

- Niagara's population is growing, and service demand is increasing.
- Municipalities are addressing complex challenges traditionally managed by upper levels of government.
- Local government funding models are outdated.
- Municipal infrastructure gap is growing without sustainable funding to support.



Last municipal funding framework update: • Federal: **19th Century** • Provincial: **2008** 



In 2022, Ontarian municipalities spent **\$4 billion** subsidizing public health and social services (AMO, 2024)



Municipalities own 60% of Canada's infrastructure but only collect 9% of total tax revenue.


