
Competitive Awards over \$5M

Current State

 Council approval required at the end of the competitive process to award

Recommendation

 Delegate award approval at the end of the competitive process to staff; recognizing Council sets project priorities, timing, and budgets through existing mechanisms







Competitive Awards over \$5M

Why the Change?

- Clarifies Council's strategic role vs. staff's administrative role
- Improves customer service with faster project starts
- Increases efficiency through greater certainty and a simplified process for contractors
- Aligns with best practices and municipal comparators
- Reduces legal risk for Council and the corporation
- Ensures compliance with legal obligations (to award based on low bid/high score)





Competitive Awards over \$5M-Municipal Comparators

Contract Amendments over \$1M

Current State

This is a gap in the existing by-law

Recommendation

- Add a robust contract amendment framework increasing transparency and clarity
- Delegate approval of contract amendments over \$1M only if:
 - Change is within the Council approved budget
 - The work is part of the original scope of the project
 - The project was competitively bid
- Inform Council of all contract amendments over \$1M





Contract Amendments over \$1M

Why the Change?

- More efficient project management, enabling faster delivery and better outcomes
- Reduces disruption for contractors, residents, businesses, and communities
- Avoids costs and financial risks from delays in approving routine project adjustments
- Increases certainty, allowing projects to proceed as planned
- E.g. unforeseen site conditions (such as soil issues) may require critical work by original contractor- this change lets the work proceed efficiently, if it is still within budget.





Safeguards - Budget

Budget

Council retains same level of approval and oversight of budget as exists currently

- Staff can only award or amend contracts under delegated authority if Council approved budget is available.
- Any budget increase requires Council approval <u>before</u> staff can award or amend contracts
- Council approves both initial budget and budget amendments per the Budget Control By-law






Safeguards - Accountability

Accountability Controls:

- Robust financial system enforces compliance with Budget and Procurement By-laws
- Ensures all financial commitments align with Council approved budgets
- Ensures all contract amendments align with delegated authority limits
- Commitment control functionality prevents project overspending
- Enables auditability and oversight of compliance









Safeguards - Reporting

Enhanced reporting:

Enhanced reporting to Council under the proposed by-law:

- New All contract amendments will be reported once cumulative value is over \$1M, on a quarterly basis
- Change All contract awards over \$5M reported via Council Weekly Correspondence for timely disclosure
- Improves transparency





Safeguards – Scope of Authority

Scope of delegated authority is clearly confined:

Staff continue to require Council approval for:

- Any change to budget
- Competitive procurements where the recommended award is not to the lowest compliant bid (tender) or highest scoring bid (RFx)
- Non-competitive awards over \$1M (including where work is not part of the original scope of the project)
- Where there is an irregularity or unresolved challenge that may expose the Region to legal, financial, or reputational risk
