

THE SWIFT REGION

- 15 WOWC Members
- 5 Municipal Capital Contributing Members
 - Caledon, Niagara, Waterloo, London, Windsor
- 221,000 underserved premises
- 41,000 underserved road kilometres
- 504,000 underserved residents
- \$2.6B cost to fibre all underserved areas







SCF PROJECT PHASES




Phase 1 2017/18 Phase 2 2019/20 Phase 3 2020-23

- SWIFT is funded under the Small Communities Fund (SCF)
- 3 Phases have been defined and relate to 3 Contribution Agreements with the province
- 3 Phases
 - Phase 1 (CA1) Business Case Development
 - Phase 2 (CA2) Projects in Norfolk, Wellington and Lambton
 - Phase 3 (CA3) Remaining SCF and non-SCF Projects

Sources Of Funding






- Federal and Provincial matching contributions
- Private Sector 1/3 of Fed/Prov contribution (minimum)
- Municipal funding covers overheads, admin and non-SCF eligible projects

Note: Funding values represent maximum funding available and assumes successful Pilot Project.

- Procurement evaluation and assessment completed with contract negotiation underway
 - Contract executions planned for the end of November
- Construction expected in 2020

- Small Communities Fund is focused on 50/10 service, not technology choices
- Technology Choices
 - FTTH
 - HFC
 - DSL
 - Wireless Broadband
- Preference given to 'scalable' technologies

SWIFT is technology agnostic and will allow bids that include any standards based technologies so long as they meet the 50/10 target



PROCUREMENT APPROACH





- Total funding budget determined per region
- Anonymized 50/10 service coverage provided by SWIFT
- Areas with current 50/10 service are ineligible for funding
- ISPs will decide which areas and technologies to propose
- SWIFT Evaluation Committee will evaluate proposals focussing on outcomes
- Board Procurement Advisory Committee validates / approves

- Evaluation based on pre-determined criteria
- Team Members (equal weight)
 - SWIFT ED
 - SWIFT Technical Manager
 - SWIFT Operations Manager
 - SWIFT Finance
 - Municipality Member (TBD)

Proposal evaluation and contract awards to be approved by SWIFT board of directors Procurement Approval Committee

PROCUREMENT EXAMPLE






- \$8M Project Budget (\$4M max bid)
- Round 1 Results
 - #1 ISP 2 ✓
 - \blacksquare #2 ISP 1 \times (overlap with ISP 2)
 - #3 ISP 3 ✓
 - $\#4 ISP 4 \times (no funding left)$
- \$6M spent
- \$2M remains
- 2nd Round of procurement would address remaining budget
- Round 1 projects would be considered exclusion zones

Phase III procurements to start in Q1 2020 assuming successful Phase II project




